Protecting Yourself from

Any person working or recreating outdoors is at risk of exposure to poisonous plants, such as poison ivy, poison oak, and poison sumac. When in contact with skin, the sap oil (urushiol) of these plants can cause an allergic reaction. Burning these poisonous plants produces smoke that, when inhaled, can cause lung irritation.

Exposure may occur through:

Direct contact with the plant
 Indirect contact (touching tools, animals, or clothing with urushiol on them)
 Inhalation of particles containing urushiol from burning plants
 Symptoms of Skin Contact:

 Red rash within a few days of contact
 Swelling
 Itching
 Possible bumps, patches, streaking or weeping blisters NOTE: Blister fluids are not contagious First Aid:

If you are exposed to a poisonous plant:

I from a reexposed to a poisonous plant:

Immediately rinse skin with rubbing alcohol, poison plant wash, or degreasing soap (such as dishwashing soap) or detergent, and lots of water.

Rinse frequently so that wash solutions do not dry on the skin and further spread the urushiol.

Scrub under nails with a brush.

Apply wet compresses, calamine lotion, or hydrocortisone cream to the skin to reduce itching and blistering.

Apply wet compressibilistering.
Oatmeal baths may relieve itching.
An antihistamine may help relieve itching. NOTE: Drowsiness may occur.
In severe cases or if the rash is on the face or genitals, seek professional medical attention.
Call 911 or go to a hospital emergency room if you have a severe allergic reaction, such as swelling or difficulty breathing, or have had a severe reaction in the past.

- Wear long sleeves, long pants, boots, and gloves. Wash exposed clothing separately in hot water with detergent.
- Barrier skin creams, such as lotion containing bentoquatum, may offer some protection.
- After use, clean tools with rubbing alcohol or soap and lots of water. Urushiol can remain active on the surface of objects for up to 5 years. Wear disposable gloves during this process.
- Do not burn plants or brush piles that may contain poison ivy, poison oak, or poison sumac. Inhaling smoke from burning plants can cause severe allergic respiratory problems. When exposure to burning poisonous plants is unavoidable, wear a A NIOSH-certified half-face piece particulate respirator rated R-95, P-95, or better. These respirators should protect against exposure to burning poisonous plants, but will not protect against all possible combustion products in smoke, such as carbon monoxide. Respirators must be worn correctly and consistently throughout the time they are used. For respirators to be effective there must be a tight seal between the user's face and the respirator.





Medication Disposal Event Set This Month for National Take-Back Day

Disposal site at Chestertown Farmer's Market

Chestertown Police and Kent County Behavioral Health this week announced prescription medication collection from 8am until 12 noon on Saturday, April 27th in Chestertown as part of National Drug

Take-Back Day.

National Drug
Day is an annua

National Drug Take-Back Day is an annual collection event sponsored by the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA). The DEA also sponsors a

collection event each October; that event saw 300 tons of medications collected across more than 4,600 sites.

For this month's event, Chestertown police will collect unused prescription medications at the Chestertown Farmer's Market in Fountain Park. Unused or expired prescription medications pose a serious public safety issue – proper disposal helps prevent misuse and abuse and helps save lives.

"We encourage everyone to properly dispose of any unused medications they may have around their home," said Chestertown Police Chief Ronald M. Dixon. "That simple action could save a life."

Collection includes unwanted medications, vitamins and supplements. Vape pens, inhalers, sharps and needles are NOT accepted. This program is anonymous – no questions asked, no identification required. The site will also include free educational materials along with free disposal and storage solutions, like Deterra bags, from Kent County Behavioral Health Prevention Office. Deterra bags allow for medication disposal at home, without endangering the environment.

"Every time we dispose of our leftover medications properly, we help prevent substance misuse," said Annette Duckery, KCBH prevention coordinator. "We know that most Kent County teens don't drink alcohol or use other drugs, and together we can help keep it that way."

In addition to this year's take-back day initiative, Kent County has three 24-hour prescription drug drop box locations – at the Kent County Sheriff's office, the Rock Hall police department, and the Chestertown police department.



Maryland's Free Senior Call Check Service

Maryland was the first state in the country to start a free, automated telephone service to check in on Maryland's older residents, all across the state. The program began in 2020 and continues today.

How does it work? Every day a telephone call will be placed to a participant at a regularly scheduled time. These calls will take place between 8am and 4pm as close as possible to the one-hour time block pre-selected by the participant. If the participant does not an-swer their first call, two more automated calls will be made. If those calls go unanswered,

an alternative person who is selected by the participant during program enrollment will be called. This could be an adult child, a neighbor, a loved one, or we will assign an alternate for you. The alternate will then be encouraged to check on the older adult program participant. The failure of the participant and alternate to answer will result in a call to your local non-emergency service.

Senior Call Check phone lines are open Monday through Friday from 8am to 5pm and Saturday 9am to 3pm. During these hours, seniors can call toll-free 1-866-50-CHECK (1-866-502-0560). Any Maryland resident who is 65 years of age or older who has a landline phone or cell phone (TTY is available) can participate. The participant and alternates should not have automated call blocking technology (or disable that feature for this program).

An alternate is a person you have selected to be called in the Senior Call Check program in the event you do not answer your automated call after three attempts. This person must be a reliable emergency contact, such as an adult child, a responsible neighbor, or a close relative. It is helpful to discuss the program with your alternate and explain their responsibility in being a support for you in the event you need help and do not pick up your daily call. If you do not have an Alternate Person, a Limited Alternate will be assigned to you. The program will notify your local non-emergency service after multiple attempts to reach you and your alternate.

How to apply: There are three options are available to apply. Visit the webpage located at www.aging.maryland.gov/pages/senior-call-check.aspx to register online. Download and print the Maryland Senior Call Check Paper Application by visiting the webpage www.aging.maryland.gov/SiteAssets/Pages/senior-call-check/Maryland%20Senior%20 Call%20Check%20Paper%20Application.pdf, complete the form and mail to: Senior Call Check, 10 North Park Drive, Hunt Valley, MD 21030. Or, call toll-free 866-502-0560 and ask to have a hard copy application mailed to your home.

Daily calls will not begin until the applicant/participant receives a call to verify all of their information. Verification will include a successful test automated call to both the participant and alternate where applicable. After all information is validated, a Welcome Packet will be mailed to your home address. The welcome letter will include your start date.

Senior Call Check is available every day of the year with the exception of six holidays when the call center is closed: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas.



Getting Acquainted With Herbs

April is the thyme for herbs. Plants already established in your garden will be putting out their new growth after each April shower. Debris and dead stems should be carefully removed without damaging the new young shoots.

When acquiring new herbs for planting, place potted plants outside in a protected place for a few days to give them a chance to adjust to the environment.

Most herbs need at least four hours of direct sunlight. Hardy rosemary and lavender like a little protection in their permanent home.

Lemon thyme gives the added flavor of lemon to the spicy thyme and can be used as universally as salt in preparing meat, fish, or poultry dishes. It is also versatile enough to be used for flavoring teas as well as cakes, cookies, and ice cream. When combined with the tender lemon verbena, the sharp lemon taste of lemon thyme is even more prominent.

Lemon verbena is a native of South America and should not be planted outdoors until the very last danger of frost. It will grow two or three feet tall and the entire plant can be harvested in the fall.

The dried leaves are just as flavorful as fresh and are good in soups, casseroles, or wherever a lemon flavor is desired. The leaves are a fragrant addition to potpourri, especially when combined with rose petals, lavender, or rosemary.

Parsley is a vital herb in any garden and should be planted each year to keep the crop available. It is classified as a "biennial" which means the main plant will live for two years. The flat leaf is tastier and preferred by chefs for culinary use but the curly leaf is greener and full of vitamin C. It is frequently used as a garnish but should be consumed for its high source of vitamins and chlorophyll. It is also a favorite herb of the caterpillar stage of the swallow butterfly, so if you want to see these butterflies, do not kill the green and black striped caterpillars when you see them on your plants. It is commonly known as the parsley worm, although it also likes fennel, dill, and may even be found on rue. Plant some extra parsley to help a pollinator.





NEW: LOWER LEAD ACTION LEVEL

To better protect Maryland children, effective October 28, 2022, the blood lead level of concern was lowered to 3.5 micrograms/deciliter. A lower level is a reflection of the progress Maryland has made in reducing childhood lead exposures. This new lower level means there will be additional children identified who may benefit from state and local resources available to help families with lead- exposed children.

No Level of Lead is Safe

Because there is no safe level of lead in a child's body, all children in Maryland are required to be tested for lead at ages one and two years or when lead exposure is suspected. Your child may be tested for lead as part of their regular care by a doctor or clinic. Be sure to ask your doctor or clinic about testing your child for lead.

If a test for lead is positive, your doctor will provide guidance and will perform follow-up testing for your child. Be sure to follow your doctor's directions carefully and allow officials to provide services, including educational recommendations, to help limit future lead exposure, information on healthy nutritional choices, environmental testing of your home and services to reduce lead-based paint hazards.

50 Year Celebration of WKHS Will Culminate with Tunefest on May 4th

With a radio handle like "Captain Space" there's likely no more appropriate a song to launch a new radio station than "Rocket Man". At around noon on March 28, 1974, after some opening news and other reports, Elton John's classic song became the first track played on 90.5 FM WKHS, Kent County High School's student radio station. This year marks radio station's 50th anniversary, with a broadcasting program that has continued to grow over the last five decades.

The station [also] received a certificate of recognition in March from the Kent County Commissioners. "At 17,500 watts, WKHS is one of a handful of high-power high school radio stations in the entire country," read Ron Fithian, president of the commissioners.

WKHS station manager Chris Singleton and fund manager Ken Collins are going big for this year's golden anniversary. The marquee event is Tunefest, a day-long concert Saturday, May 4th featuring local musicians and food trucks at Red Acres Farm, next door to KCHS in Worton. Tickets are on sale now at www.wkhsradio.org.

The station also received special recognition for its anniversary from the Society of Broadcast Engineers (SBE). Members of the SBE paid tribute to WKHS in March, hosting a business meeting in the broadcasting classroom at the high school. Special guests included SBE Executive Director Jim Ragsdale, regional members and former WKHS managers and alumni.

Chris Singleton, himself a WKHS and Kent County High School alum, became the station man-

ager and broadcasting teacher in 2008. Willard is now at TelevisaUnivision and Van Dyke works for WideOrbit, a broadcasting software company of which WKHS is a client. "You all are very lucky to be in this program," Willard told the current crop of WKHS students who sat in on the meeting. "I can tell you I'm still in broadcasting and most of my colleagues from the Class of 1980 are still in broadcasting because of this program." Van Dyke told

the students and guests about all the fun he and his classmates had in the studio, trying to crack one another up during newscasts and genuinely enjoying their time on air. He said Hammond was not just a radio station manager to them, he was also an important teacher.

And students are not the only on-air talent. The station has expanded its programming to include local volunteers who share their musical passions and a partnership with Philadelphia-based WXPN. When students and volunteers are not on the air, WXPN keeps the music going on 90.5 FM. Another hoped for event on the horizon this year at WKHS is a linkup with the International Space Station (ISS). The station teamed up with the Kent Amateur Radio Society in applying to make contact with the ISS through the Amateur Radio on the International Space Station program. "I think there's only 20 to 25 organizations chosen each year," Singleton said. If the WKHS application to make contact is approved, students will get about 10 minutes of talk time with the ISS as it orbits overhead at 17,500 miles per hour. "That's a direct link. It's not from the internet. It's directly from air to ground," Singleton said. "So we're hoping to see that happen."



What is HealthChoice?

HealthChoice is Maryland's Medicaid managed care program. Most people who qualify for Medicaid are required to enroll in a Managed Care Organization (MCO). It is best to select an MCO that your doctor participates with. If your doctor does not participate in the MCO you select or are assigned to, you will need to choose another primary care doctor (PCP) to oversee your medical care.

What is a HealthChoice MCO?

An MCO is a group of doctors, clinics, and other health care providers who work together to take care of HealthChoice members health care needs. MCOs are responsible to provide or arrange for most of your health care services including most pharmacy services. Some services such as mental health and substance use disorder services and certain drugs are covered by the State and not your MCO.

The Administrative Care Coordinator serves as a local resource for all HealthChoice members. The ACCU can:

- Help you understand your HealthChoice benefits and how to access services
- Explain your MCO choices
- Help you find a primary care doctor or specialist in your MCO's network (You can change PCPs at any time.)
- Help you find a dentist (Dental services for children and adults are covered through the Maryland Healthy Smiles Program.)
- Help link you to Medicaid transportation services (MCOs are not required to provide transportation.)
- Help you get your prescriptions filled
- Explain the health care services you can get out of network and without a referral, like prenatal care (if you already started prenatal care) and family planning services
- Explain your annual right to change MCOs

More examples of help that is only a phone call away:

- More examples of help that is only a phone call away
- Explain how to renew your Medicaid benefits through the Maryland Health Connection
- Explain how to keep your information updated and how to get a new Medicaid card if your card is lost or stolen
- Help you resolve a billing issue
- Explain your appeal & grievance rights
 Target populations include children, pregnant and
 postpartum women, individuals with disabilities (physical,
 mental or developmental), and homeless individuals. The
 ACC can help anyone who is eligible for HealthChoice.

Ombudsman

The local Ombudsman acts as an advocate for your health care needs. An Ombudsman may contact you when there are complex medical issues involving care coordination with the MCO. The HealthChoice Program may also request that an Ombudsman contact you to ensure that any complaints that you have about your health care or MCO have been resolved.
