



Medication Disposal Event Set This Month for National Take-Back Day

Disposal site at Chestertown Farmer's Market

Chestertown Police and Kent County Behavioral Health this week announced prescription medication collection from 8am until 12 noon on Saturday, April 27th in Chestertown as part of National Drug



National Drug Take-Back Day is an annual collection sponsored by event the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA). The DEA also sponsors a

collection event each October; that event saw 300 tons of medications collected across more than 4,600 sites

For this month's event, Chestertown police will collect unused prescription medications at the Chestertown Farmer's Market in Fountain Park. Unused or expired prescription medications pose a serious public safety issue - proper disposal helps prevent misuse and abuse and helps save lives.

"We encourage everyone to properly dispose of any unused medications they may have around their home," said Chestertown Police Chief Ronald M. Dixon. "That simple action could save a life."

Collection includes unwanted medications, vitamins and supplements. Vape pens, inhalers, sharps and needles are NOT accepted. This program is anonymous - no questions asked, no identification required. The site will also include free educational materials along with free disposal and storage solutions, like Deterra bags, from Kent County Behavioral Health Prevention Office. Deterra bags allow for medication disposal at home, without endangering the environment.

"Every time we dispose of our leftover medications properly, we help prevent substance misuse," said Annette Duckery, KCBH prevention coordinator. "We know that most Kent County teens don't drink alcohol or use other drugs, and together we can help keep it that way

In addition to this year's take-back day initiative, Kent County has three 24-hour prescription drug drop box locations - at the Kent County Sheriff's office, the Rock Hall police department, and the Chestertown police department.

Denmark's flag, adopted in 1219, is the oldest. ponsorec • A flag expert is called a "vexillologist." • The blue field on the U.S. Flag is called the "union." • On Memorial Day (the last Monday in May), to honor all who died in battle, the flag should be displayed at half-staff until noon only, then raised to the top of the staff for the remainder of the day. • Since 1834, the U.S. Flag has flown continuously next to the grave of the Revolutionary War hero, the Marquis de Lafayette, near Paris, France. • June 14 was proclaimed Flag Day by President Woodrow Wilson in 1916. While Flag Day was a popular celebration in scores of communities for many years after Wilson's proclamation, it didn't receive its official Congressional designation until 1949. The United States Flag should always be treated with the utmost care and respect. First Tour of Historic Churches of Dixon Tavern District Set for April 27th

Queen Anne's County which will be held on Saturday, April 27th from 10am to 40m. The tour begins at Calvary-Asbury United Methodist Church, located at 103 North Church Street in Sudlersville, where maps and information will be distributed. Historical displays, light snacks, and restrooms will also be available at this site.

You may wonder what in the world is the "Dixon Tavern District No 1". In 1827, the Maryland State Legislature established the Dixon Tavern District as one of the four voting/ taxing districts in Queen Anne's County. It was basically the areas around present day Sudlersville, north to the Kent County line, east to the Delaware line, west to present day Route 290, and south to present day Ingleside. It was named after a once very lively crossroads that lay just about one-and-a-half miles south of Sudlersville. All that remains of Dixon Tavern today is a county road that bears that name.

What the tour entails is a 36-mile round trip self-driving tour of the churches that were in existence in the Dixon Tavern District prior to the year 1900, that still are standing today. There are eleven and eight are still in use as churches today. At press time, all but three of the eleven sites will be open for viewing by the public with the others available for exterior viewing only.

Sudlersville Community Betterment Club is a non-profit organization founded in 1916 that is made up of a small group of community members with the purpose of collecting, preserving and maintaining the history of Sudlersville and the surrounding community, serving with a sense of pride in the community's past, present and future. Club projects include maintaining the Sudlersville Train Station, the Jimmie Foxx Memorial statue, and helping on significant holidays to memorialize veterans buried at Sudlersville Cemetery. The Train Station is part of the Queen Anne's County Historic Sites Consortium and is open May through December on the first Saturday from 10am to 2pm, showcasing various displays of historic and community interest.

What is HealthChoice?

HealthChoice is Maryland's Medicaid managed care program. Most people who qualify for Medicaid are required to enroll in a Managed Care Organization (MCO). It is best to select an MCO that your doctor participates with. If your doctor does not participate in the MCO you select or are assigned to, you will need to choose another primary care doctor (PCP) to oversee your medical care.

What is a HealthChoice MCO?

An MCO is a group of doctors, clinics, and other health care providers who work together to take care of HealthChoice members health care needs. MCOs are responsible to provide or arrange for most of your health care services including most pharmacy services. Some services such as mental health and substance use disorder services and certain drugs are covered by the State and not your MCO.

The Administrative Care Coordinator serves as a local resource for all HealthChoice members. The ACCU can:

- Help you understand your HealthChoice benefits and how to access services
- Explain your MCO choices
- Help you find a primary care doctor or specialist in your MCO's network (You can change PCPs at any time.)
- Help you find a dentist (Dental services for children and adults are covered through the Maryland Healthy Smiles Program.)
- Help link you to Medicaid transportation services (MCOs are not required to provide transportation.)
- Help you get your prescriptions filled
- Explain the health care services you can get out of network and without a referral, like prenatal care (if you already started prenatal care) and family planning services
- Explain your annual right to change MCOs

The HealthChoice Program may also request that an Ombudsman contact you to ensure that any complaints that you have about your health care or MCO have been resolved.

Chestertown Recreation Commission Seeks Public Input on Parks and Trails

The Chestertown Recreation Commission invites the public to attend a community meeting on Tuesday, April 30th at Town Hall (118 North Cross Street) at 7pm to help plan the future development of Chestertown's park system.

A similar community meeting recently held at Kent County Middle School focused specifically on the largely undeveloped Margo Bailey Park. Twenty-four people attended. Small groups pored over maps and drew ideas for facilities and activities they'd like to see. The general discussion that followed led to a rough consensus that the southern portion of the park near Heron Point should emphasize open green space with meadows, paths, benches, and a picnic pavilion. The northern end near Chestertown Landing could include such features as a large playground, a kiddie splash pad/fountain, a beach volleyball area, and a multi-purpose playing field for team sports. The community members present did not agree about some other major proposals, such as a music performance space, a skate park, or pickleball courts.

More discussion and ideas about Bailey Park will be entertained at the April 30th meeting. Recommendations will also be gathered for the Town's other parks, including Gateway Sports Park (behind Royals Farms), Ajax Downtown Park (off the Rail Trail), and Carpenter Park (in the Washington Park neighborhood).

Possible locations for new parks will also be considered. The Recreation Commission is particularly interested in suggestions for new walking trails that connect neighborhoods. Nature trails throughout the Radcliffe Creek watershed have been proposed by some.

The April 30th meeting is an important step in the development of Chestertown's first Ten-Year Parks and Recreation Plan. Also informing the Plan are the results of past community surveys, a fresh survey conducted online last September, community meetings, and youth focus groups.

ShoreStrategies, LLC, a regional consulting firm that helped Kent County develop its current five-year parks plan, has been contracted by the Town to guide and assist the Recreation Commission. A draft of the Ten-Year Master Parks & Recreation Plan will be open for public comment later in the year. Once the Plan is completed, the Town of Chestertown will be well-placed to seek grant funding from the State of Maryland and other sources to gradually build out the community's desires.

Maryland's Free Senior Call Check Service



Maryland was the first state in the country to start a free, automated telephone service to check in on Maryland's older residents, all across the state. The program began in 2020 and continues today.

How does it work? Every day a telephone call will be placed to a participant at a regularly scheduled time. These calls will take place between 8am and 4pm as close as possible to the one-hour time block pre-selected by the participant. If the participant does not an-

swer their first call, two more automated calls will be made. If those calls go unanswered, an alternative person who is selected by the participant during program enrollment will be called. This could be an adult child, a neighbor, a loved one, or we will assign an alternate for you. The alternate will then be encouraged to check on the older adult program participant. The failure of the participant and alternate to answer will result in a call to your local non-emergency service.

Senior Call Check phone lines are open Monday through Friday from 8am to 5pm and Saturday 9am to 3pm. During these hours, seniors can call toll-free 1-866-50-CHECK (1-866-502-0560). Any Maryland resident who is 65 years of age or older who has a landline phone or cell phone (TTY is available) can participate. The participant and alternates should not have automated call blocking technology (or disable that feature for this program).

An alternate is a person you have selected to be called in the Senior Call Check program in the event you do not answer your automated call after three attempts. This person must be a reliable emergency contact, such as an adult child, a responsible neighbor, or a close relative. It is helpful to discuss the program with your alternate and explain their responsibility in being a support for you in the event you need help and do not pick up your daily call. If you do not have an Alternate Person, a Limited Alternate will be assigned to you. The program will notify your local non-emergency service after multiple attempts to reach you and your alternate.

How to apply: There are three options are available to apply. Visit the webpage located at www.aging.maryland.gov/pages/senior-call-check.aspx to register online. Download and print the Maryland Senior Call Check Paper Application by visiting the webpage www. aging.maryland.gov/SiteAssets/Pages/senior-call-check/Maryland%20Senior%20 Call%20Check%20Paper%20Application.pdf, complete the form and mail to: Senior Call Check, 10 North Park Drive, Hunt Valley, MD 21030. Or, call toll-free 866-502-0560 and ask to have a hard copy application mailed to your home.

Daily calls will not begin until the applicant/participant receives a call to verify all of their information. Verification will include a successful test automated call to both the participant and alternate where applicable. After all information is validated, a Welcome Packet will be mailed to your home address. The welcome letter will include your start date.

Senior Call Check is available every day of the year with the exception of six holidays when the call center is closed: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas.

NEW: LOWER LEAD ACTION LEVEL

To better protect Maryland children, effective October 28, 2022, the blood lead level of concern was lowered to 3.5 micrograms/deciliter. A lower level is a reflection of the progress Maryland has made in reducing childhood lead exposures. This new lower level means there will be additional children identified who may benefit from state and local resources available to help families with lead- exposed children.

Acceptable blood levels will decrease from 5 micrograms/deciliter to 3.5 micrograms/deciliter.




No Level of Lead is Safe

Because there is no safe level of lead in a child's body, all children in Maryland are required to be tested for lead at ages one and two years or when lead exposure is suspected. Your child may be tested for lead as part of their regular care by a doctor or clinic. Be sure to ask your doctor or clinic about testing your child for lead.

If a test for lead is positive, your doctor will provide guidance and will perform followup testing for your child. Be sure to follow your doctor's directions carefully and allow officials to provide services, including educational recommendations, to help limit future lead exposure, information on healthy nutritional choices, environmental testing of your home and services to reduce lead-based paint hazards.

Spotted Lanternflies Persist in 2024

The spotted lanternfly has invaded 17 states including Maryland, Delaware, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and West Virginia. Spotted lanternfly is a type of planthopper insect that feeds in large groups

on a wide range of plants includ-

ing grapes, peaches, apples, walnuts, oaks, and pines. They do not bite or sting people or pets.

Both adults and nymphs feed by

sucking sap from plant stems, trunks, and leaves. Feeding can Spotted lanternfly 1st instar. As the insects feed, they excrete a sugary honeydew that attracts bees, wasps, and ants, and supports the growth of black sooty mold that blocks sunlight from leaves. Eggs hatch from late April to early May. Adults first appear from mid-July to feed and mate, and to lay eggs from late September

until frost Learn the insect's unique appearance and inspect your property.

In residential yards and gardens, the recommended approach is to physically kill any spotted lanternflies that are reachable safely. Kill spotted lanternfly adults and nymphs by crushing them with gloved hands, stomping on them by foot, smashing them with fly swatters or rackets, or drowning them in a container of soapy water or rubbing alcohol (isopropyl alcohol).

Scrape egg masses off of plants and hard surfaces such as lawn furniture, decks, and concrete surfaces using a plastic card or tool such as a putty knife. The eggs must then be crushed in order to kill them. Eggs can be crushed with gloved hands or dropped into a container of rubbing alcohol or hand sanitizer.

Purchase a trap or build a circle trap. Or, use a shop vacuum to suck up SLF; then kill and discard them.

Kent County is currently designated as an infected area therefore, mandatory reporting is no longer required, however, residents are still encouraged to re-port any sightings of SLF to MDA. Reporting can be done online. For any inqui-ries or concerns related to SLF, individuals may reach out to MDA by emailing dontbug.md@maryland.gov or by calling 410-841-5920.







Protecting Yourself from

Any person working or recreating outdoors is at risk of exposure to poisonous plants, such as poison ivy, poison oak, and poison sumac. When in contact with skin, the sap oil (urushiol) of these plants can cause an allergic reaction. Burning these poisonous plants produces smoke that, when inhaled, can cause lung irritation.

Exposure may occur through:

- Direct contact with the plant
 Indirect contact (touching tools, animals, or clothing with urushiol on them)
 Inhalation of particles containing urushiol from burning plants
- Symptoms of Skin Contact:

 Red rash within a few days of contact
 Swelling
 Itching
 Possible bumps, patches, streaking or weeping blisters NOTE: Blister fluids are not contagious First Aid:

- If you are exposed to a poisonous plant:
 Immediately rinse skin with rubbing alcohol, poison plant wash, or degreasing soap (such as dishwashing soap) or detergent, and lots of water.
 Rinse frequently so that wash solutions do not dry on the skin and further spread the urushiol.
 Scrub under nails with a brush.
 Apply wet compresses, calamine lotion, or hydrocortisone cream to the skin to reduce itching and blistering.

- Apply wer compresses, series
 blistering.
 Oatmeal baths may relieve itching.
 An antihistamine may help relieve itching. *NOTE: Drowsiness may occur.*In severe cases or if the rash is on the face or genitals, seek professional medical attention.
 Call 911 or go to a hospital emergency room if you have a severe allergic reaction, such as swelling or difficulty breathing, or have had a severe reaction in the past.
- Wear long sleeves, long pants, boots, and gloves. Wash exposed clothing separately in hot water with detergent.
- Barrier skin creams, such as lotion containing bentoquatum, may offer some protection.
- After use, clean tools with rubbing alcohol or soap and lots of water. Urushiol can remain active on the surface of objects for up to 5 years. Wear disposable gloves during this process.
- Do not burn plants or brush piles that may contain poison ivy, poison oak, or poison sumac. Inhaling smoke from burning plants can cause severe allergic respiratory problems. When exposure to burning poisonous plants is unavoidable, wear a A NIOSH-certified half-face piece particulate respirator rated R–95, P–95, or better. These respirators should protect against exposure to burning poisonous plants, but will not protect against all possible combustion products in smoke, such as carbon monoxide. Respirators must be worn correctly and consistently throughout the time they are used. For respirators to be effective there must be a tight seal between the user's face and the respirator.



Sitting under the stars by a crackling fire has its appeal. It's where stories are told, sing-a-longs happen, and meals are cooked over an open flame. Campfires bring family and friends together. But campfire mishaps can cause injuries. With a few safety tips, you can prevent these accidents.

SAFETY AROUND THE FIRE

- Before setting up a campfire, be sure it is permitted. Check with your local fire department.
- If campfires are permitted, they need to be at least 25 feet away from any structure and anything that can burn.
- Clear away dry leaves and sticks, overhanging low branches and shrubs.
- Avoid burning on windy, dry days. It is easier for open burning to spread out of control when it is windy and dry.
- Watch children while the fire is burning. Never let children or pets play or stand too close to the fire.
- Attend to the campfire at all times. A campfire left alone for only a few minutes can grow into a damaging fire.
- Keep a campfire small which is easier to control. Never use gasoline or other flammable or
- combustible liquids.
- Always have a hose, bucket of water, or shovel and dirt or sand nearby to put out the fire. Make sure to put it completely out before leaving the site.
- If your clothes catch fire, stop, drop, and roll. Stop, drop to the ground and cover your face with your hands. Roll over and over or back and forth until the fire is out.
- Treat a burn right away. Cool the burn with cool water for 3 to 5 minutes. Cover with a clean, dry cloth. Get medical help if needed.






