Protect Yourself

- When a thunderstorm threatens, get inside a home or large building or inside a vehicle (not a convertible).
- Inside a home, avoid using the telephone except for emergencies.
- If outside, with no time to reach a safe building or an automobile, follow these rules:
- Do not stand underneath a natural lightning rod such as a tall, isolated tree
- Avoid projecting above the surrounding landscape, as you would do if you were standing on a hilltop, in an open field, on the beach, or fishing from a small boat.
- Get out of and away from open water.
- Get away from tractors and other metal farm equipment.
- $\label{lem:control_general} \textbf{Get off of and away from motorcycles}, \textbf{scooters, golf carts and bicycles}. \textbf{Put down golf clubs}.$
- Stay away from wire fences, clotheslines, metal pipes, rails and other metallic paths which could carry lightning to you from some distance away.
- Avoid standing in small isolated sheds or other small structures in open areas.
- In a forest, seek shelter in a low area under a thick growth of small trees. In open areas, go to a low place such as a ravine or valley. Be alert for flash floods.
- If you're hopelessly isolated in a level field or prairie and you feel your hair stand on end - indicating lightning is about to strike - drop to your knees and bend forward putting your hands on your knees. Do not lie flat on the ground.

The United States Flag, adopted on June 14, 1777, is the fourth oldest national flag in the world. Denmark's flag, adopted in 1219, is the oldest.

- A flag expert is called a "vexillologist."
- The blue field on the U.S. Flag is called the "union."
- On Memorial Day (the last Monday in May), to honor all who died in battle, the flag should be displayed at half-staff until noon only, then raised to the top of the staff for the remainder of the day.
- Since 1834, the U.S. Flag has flown continuously next to the grave of the Revolutionary War hero, the Marquis de Lafavette, near Paris, France,
- June 14 was proclaimed Flag Day by President Woodrow Wilson in 1916. While Flag Day was a popular celebration in scores of communities for many years after Wilson's proclamation, it didn't receive its official Congressional designation until 1949.

The United States Flag should always be treated with the utmost care and respect. Remember, the flag represents a living country, and as such, is considered a living thing.

- Always display the flag with the blue union field up never display the flag upside down, except as a distress signal.
- It is the universal custom to display the flag only from sunrise to sunset on buildings and on stationary flag staffs in the open. However, when a patriotic effect is desired, the flag may be displayed twenty-four hours a day if properly illuminated during the hours of darkness.
- · Always hold the flag carefully never let it touch anything beneath it: the ground, the floor, water or merchandise.
- Always keep the flag aloft and free never carry it flat or horizontally.
- Always keep the flag clean and safe never let it become torn, soiled or damaged.
- Always dispose of a flag properly, preferably through veterans' organizations.
- Always treat the flag with respect.







2024 Cicadas Primarily in Midwest



Cicadas will emerge this year, primarily in the Midwest, in late April and early May. Two different broods will emerge this year: 17-year Brood XIII in Northern Illinois and 13-year Brood XIX in parts of the Southeastern United States. A dual emergence of these two broods occurs once every 221 years – the last occurrence was in 1803 and the next occurrence will be in 2245! Although some cicadas may emerge on the Eastern Shore this year, noticeable periodical cicada emergence is not expected in this area until next year for Brood XIV, 2030 for Brood II, 2033 for Brood V, and 2038 for Brood X.

- You may see a new label on the inside of new life jackets with a performance level icon. These are approved for use in the U.S. and Canada, whereas devices with the old labels continue to be approved in one country or the other, not both.
- Life jackets you may already own may have the old "type" life jacket label
- The new label DOES NOT make obsolete life jackets with the old label (you can continue to use your life jacket as long as it is in good condition and appropriate for the activity).

- WEAR IT The best life jacket is one you will wear.
- **ACTIVITY** It should be appropriate for the recreational water activity.
- FIT A snug fit is a proper fit. All straps, buckles, and zippers should be secure.
- **CONDITION** Life jackets with a tear, broken pieces, or buoyancy loss should be disposed.



Before firing up your grill this season, the National Propane Gas Association reminds you to stay safe while barbecuing. Before lighting your propane grill, a few precautions will help ensure hours of safe grilling.

First, clean and check the burners and all connections on your gas grill. Use a soap and water mixture to make sure they are not leaking. Check the hosesto make sure they are not cracked, brittle or damaged. And make sure the connection between your grill and tank is tight. You can sometimes smell a leak in your grill before you see it because an odor has been added to propane to help you detect any leaks.

When you are finished grilling, don't forget to turn off the propane tank, and remember to store cylinders upright in a cool place.

This simple list of do's and don'ts can help make all of your barbecues successful:

- Do follow the manufacturer's grilling instructions for safe grilling.
- Don't grill close to the house or other structures and don't place your grill on a surface that will burn.
- Do store your propane cylinders upright in a cool place outside away from the grill.
- Don't use your grill inside a structure or store cylinders there.
- Don't let children play near a hot grill.
- Do take empty cylinders to trained professionals for filling and repairs.





Robert Hanford Ingersoll of Chestertown, Maryland, passed away peacefully at his home on April 29, 2024. Bob was born at Kent and Queen's Anne Hospital on June 13, 1947. He was the second of four sons born to Daniel Winthrop Ingersoll and Clare (Pat) Stevens Ingersoll. His childhood was spent on Silver Hill Farm in Quaker Neck where he learned a great deal about nature, farming, and mechanics from his parents. After graduating from Chestertown High School in 1965, Bob attended the University of Virginia. Following a semester in Charlottesville, he transferred to the University of Maryland and studied there until June of 1967, when he

surprised his parents by signing up to join the United States. Navy. This decision turned out to be pivotal in Bob's life. After training to become Aviation Machinist Mate, Bob was stationed in Brunswick, Maine with Naval Patrol Squadron Ten. Patrol Squadron Ten was deployed to Iceland, the Azores, and Bermuda for extended periods during his time of enlistment, adding considerably to his world experience.

Bob married Maine resident Gladys Mobbs in 1969 and in 1970 his daughter Erica was born. When his active Navy enlistment was over in 1971, Bob returned to Chestertown with his family. He attended Chesapeake College and Washington College getting closer to his degree at each. While back in Quaker Neck going to college, he restored a farmhouse, co-edited a book, volunteered for various nonprofits, and helped start the earliest recycling effort in Kent County on Washington Avenue.

In 1973 Bob returned to Brunswick, Maine and finished his pursuit of a political science degree with a BA at the University of Southern Maine. He also joined the Naval Reserve unit at the Naval Air Station in Brunswick and began his career as a lobster fisherman by purchasing a boat with a close friend from the Navy. While he found the work to be exciting and put him on the ocean that he loved, it also was perilous and cold. Four years into the venture he retired, after nearly drowning in the Atlantic during a winter trap-hauling mishap. Bob turned to carpentry for the next phase of his career.

Bob and Gayle (nee Miller) Betts were married on July 14, 1982. Gayle had a daughter, Danielle and a son, Jason. Bob then began working as a sailboat chartering captain during warmer months. Eventually, sailing resulted in the creation of the Long Reach Charter Company, owned and operated with Gayle. Long Reach Charter would charter sailboats in Maine in the summers and then move operations to beautiful island locations during the winter months. Gayle and Bob were able to sail to many exciting and memorable locations.

Following the death of his father in 2005, Bob and Gayle moved home to Silver Hill Farm. Bob wished to be supportive of his recently widowed mother and to help her manage the farm. Bob dedicated his skills and spare time to helping make the Chestertown community a better place to live and the Chester River a better river to enjoy. His volunteer efforts were immense. He offered his contracting talents, free of any fees, to supervising important construction projects: Sumner Hall, Sultana (all of them from the Schooner Sultana to the latest Lawrence Preserve Project), the Chestertown Marina project, the Kent County Arts Council building restoration, and Kent Attainable's new and planned single family homes.

Bob also worked with Rebuilding Together Kent County on important smaller projects, worked at the polls during elections, and on the Board for the Kent County Library Foundation and ShoreRivers. Privately, he would help any individual who had a problem that he could solve. His mechanical knowledge and diagnostic skills were incredible to behold and his energy was infectious to all those around him.

Bob is survived by his wife Gayle and her children, Danielle Felts (Cory), their children Lily, Boone and Darby, and Jason Betts; his daughter Erica Ingersoll, her children, Kirk Arnold and Lyndsay Arnold; his three brothers, Daniel Ingersoll, Jr. (Kate); William Ingersoll (Susan); and Jared Ingersoll (Elizabeth King) and many cherished nieces, nephews and cousins.

What is HealthChoice?

HealthChoice is Maryland's Medicaid managed care program. Most people who qualify for Medicaid are required to enroll in a Managed Care Organization (MCO). It is best to select an MCO that your doctor participates with. If your doctor does not participate in the MCO you select or are assigned to, you will need to choose another primary care doctor (PCP) to oversee your medical care.

What is a HealthChoice MCO?

An MCO is a group of doctors, clinics, and other health care providers who work together to take care of HealthChoice members health care needs. MCOs are responsible to provide or arrange for most of your health care services including most pharmacy services. Some services such as mental health and substance use disorder services and certain drugs are covered by the State and not your MCO.

The Administrative Care Coordinator serves as a local resource for all HealthChoice members. The ACCU can:

- Help you understand your HealthChoice benefits and how to access services
- Explain your MCO choices
- Help you find a primary care doctor or specialist in your MCO's network (You can change PCPs at any time.)
- Help you find a dentist (Dental services for children and adults are covered through the Maryland Healthy Smiles Program.)
- Help link you to Medicaid transportation services (MCOs are not required to provide transportation.)
- Help you get your prescriptions filled
- Explain the health care services you can get out of network and without a referral, like prenatal care (if you already started prenatal care) and family planning services
- Explain your annual right to change MCOs

More examples of help that is only a phone call away:

- More examples of help that is only a phone call away
- Explain how to renew your Medicaid benefits through the Maryland Health Connection
- Explain how to keep your information updated and how to get a new Medicaid card if your card is lost or stolen
- Help you resolve a billing issue
- Explain your appeal & grievance rights
 Target populations include children, pregnant and
 postpartum women, individuals with disabilities (physical,
 mental or developmental), and homeless individuals. The
 ACC can help anyone who is eligible for HealthChoice.

Ombudsman

The local Ombudsman acts as an advocate for your health care needs. An Ombudsman may contact you when there are complex medical issues involving care coordination with the MCO. The HealthChoice Program may also request that an Ombudsman contact you to ensure that any complaints that you have about your health care or MCO have been resolved.



Campfire SAFETY

Sitting under the stars by a crackling fire has its appeal. It's where stories are told, sing-a-longs happen, and meals are cooked over an open flame. Campfires bring family and friends together. But campfire mishaps can cause injuries. With a few safety tips, you can prevent these accidents.

SAFETY AROUND THE FIRE

- Before setting up a campfire, be sure it is permitted. Check with your local fire department.
- If campfires are permitted, they need to be at least 25 feet away from any structure and anything that can burn.
- Clear away dry leaves and sticks, overhanging low branches and shrubs.
- Avoid burning on windy, dry days. It is easier for open burning to spread out of control when it is windy and dry.
- Watch children while the fire is burning. Never let children or pets play or stand too close to the fire.
- Attend to the campfire at all times. A campfire left alone for only a few minutes can grow into a damaging fire.
- Keep a campfire small which is easier to control.
- Never use gasoline or other flammable or combustible liquids.
- Always have a hose, bucket of water, or shovel and dirt or sand nearby to put out the fire. Make sure to put it completely out before leaving the site.
- If your clothes catch fire, stop, drop, and roll. Stop, drop to the ground and cover your face with your hands. Roll over and over or back and forth until the fire is out.
- Treat a burn right away. Cool the burn with cool water for 3 to 5 minutes. Cover with a clean, dry cloth. Get medical help if needed.



ROAST WITH CARE

If roasting marshmallows, help young children. Never shake a roasting marshmallow. It can turn into a flying, flaming ball. A heated metal skewer can cause burns.





APPLE DUMPLINGS

Cooking Spray
2 Large Granny Smith Apples, peeled and cored
Two 8 Oz Cans Refrigerated Crescent Rolls
3/4 Cup Unsalted Butter
1 Tsp Ground Cinnamon

1/4 Tsp Kosher Salt 3/4 Cup, plus 2 Tbsp Packed Light Brown Sugar, divided 3 Tbsp Apple Brandy

1 Cup Citrus-Flavored Soft Drink (like Mountain Dew) Whipped Cream

Preheat oven to 350°F. Coat a 13- x 9-inch baking dish with cooking spray; set aside.

Cut apples evenly into eight slices each. Unroll crescent roll dough, separating triangles and placing them side-by-side on a work surface. Place one apple slice along the wide side of each triangle and roll up completely. Repeat process with remaining apple slices and dough. Arrange wrapped apple slices in prepared baking dish.


Melt butter, cinnamon, salt, and 3/4 cup of the brown sugar in a medium saucepan over medium-low, whisking occasionally, until sugar is dissolved, about 3 to 5 minutes. Bring mixture to a boil, whisking constantly, until mixture is slightly thickened, about 2 minutes. Remove from heat, and whisk in brandy.

Pour butter mixture evenly over crescent rolls in prepared baking dish. Pour citrus-flavored soft drink around crescent rolls in prepared baking dish. Sprinkle tops of crescent rolls evenly with remaining two tablespoons brown sugar. Bake in preheated oven until crescent rolls are evenly browned and apples are tender, about 35 to 40 minutes. Remove from oven, and let stand in baking dish for 5 minutes before serving. Top warm dumplings with whipped cream; serve immediately.

Getting Acquainted With Herbs

The merry merry month of May brings May Day, May Baskets, May Festivals, May Pole, May Wine, and the traditional herb of the season, *Galium Odoratum*, better known as Sweet Woodruff.

When marinated in Rhine wine sweet woodruff is the beverage called Mae Bowle, served at festivals celebrating the spring season. The small white blossoms floating in the Mae Bowle serve as a decorative touch and proof of the added flavor to the wine. They are edible and are also used as a garnish for other dishes.

A ground-covering plant that likes the shade, woodruff is valued for its flowers and sweet smelling foliage. Although the fresh leaves have no distinct fragrance, when dried they have the fragrance of new mown hay, a grassy vanilla-like scent.

A bowl of dried woodruff at the entrance of a home is a sign of welcome. This herb can be used in potpourri and also act as an insect repellent due to the content of courmarin in the plant.

As a culinary herb it is used to flavor tea and ice cream, as well as May Wine.

In Germany the syrup made from woodruff is called Waldmeister and is used to flavor beverages and the beer known as Berliner Weisse.

This aromatic shade-loving ground cover is also deer and rabbit repellent herb.

What is HealthChoice?

HealthChoice is Maryland's Medicaid managed care program. Most people who qualify for Medicaid are required to enroll in a Managed Care Organization [MCO]. It is best to select an MCO that your doctor participates with. If your doctor does not participate in the MCO you select or are assigned to, you will need to choose another primary care doctor [PCP] to oversee your medical care.

What is a HealthChoice MCO?

An MCO is a group of doctors, clinics, and other health care providers who work together to take care of HealthChoice members health care needs. MCOs are responsible to provide or arrange for most of your health care services including most pharmacy services. Some services such as mental health and substance use disorder services and certain drugs are covered by the State and not your MCO.

The Administrative Care Coordinator serves as a local resource for all HealthChoice members. The ACCU can:

- Help you understand your HealthChoice benefits and how to access services
- Explain your MCO choices
- Help you find a primary care doctor or specialist in your MCO's network (You can change PCPs at any time.)
- Help you find a dentist (Dental services for children and adults are covered through the Maryland Healthy Smiles Program.)
- Help link you to Medicaid transportation services (MCOs are not required to provide transportation.)
- Help you get your prescriptions filled
- Explain the health care services you can get out of network and without a referral, like prenatal care (if you already started prenatal care) and family planning services
- Explain your annual right to change MCOs

More examples of help that is only a phone call away:

- More examples of help that is only a phone call away
- Explain how to renew your Medicaid benefits through the Maryland Health Connection
- Explain how to keep your information updated and how to get a new Medicaid card if your card is lost or stolen
- Help you resolve a billing issue
- Explain your appeal & grievance rights
 Target populations include children, pregnant and postpartum women, individuals with disabilities (physical, mental or developmental), and homeless individuals. The ACC can help anyone who is eligible for

HealthChoice.

The local Ombudsman acts as an advocate for your health care needs. An Ombudsman may contact you when there are complex medical issues involving care coordination with the MCO. The HealthChoice Program may also request that an Ombudsman contact you to ensure that any complaints that you have about your health care or MCO have been resolved.

Your child may be tested for lead as part of their regular care by a doctor or clinic. Be sure to ask your doctor or clinic about testing your child for lead.

If a test for lead is positive, your doctor will provide guidance and will perform followup testing for your child. Be sure to follow testing of your home and services to reduce



Maryland's Striped Bass Emergency Closure Continues through May 15th

The Maryland Department of Natural Resources reminds anglers that Maryland's striped bass fishing closure began on April $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ and runs through May $\mathbf{15}^{\text{th}}$ in the Chesapeake Bay and its tributaries.

Emergency regulations, enacted by the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission and approved by Maryland General Assembly's Joint Committee on Administrative, Executive, and Legislative Review, were put in place to try to better protect large migratory striped bass after several years of below average spawning success. The regulations effectively closed Maryland's "trophy" season during which striped bass longer than 35 inches have been harvested in Chesapeake Bay waters.

As in past years, targeting striped bass in the Chesapeake Bay and its tidal tributaries has been prohibited throughout April. Catch and release is prohibited and anyone who accidentally catches a striped bass must release it into the water immediately. Emergency regulations have extended the closure – which prohibits all targeting – an additional two weeks, through May 15th. This violation is punishable by fines up to \$1,000 for the first offense, and up to one year in jail and/or a \$2,000 maximum fine for second offenses.

Given the changes, Maryland Natural Resources Police (NRP) encourages the public to familiarize themselves with the new regulations. NRP plans on regular enforcement patrols to identify striped bass targeting and out-of-season takes.

Similar to the annual striped bass closure in the last two weeks of July, where temperatures are at their peak in Maryland, these two weeks in May are closed for the benefit of the species. The closure in April and May is meant to encourage a healthy spawn as large striped bass make their way from the Atlantic Ocean and up the Chesapeake Bay to spawn in the same Maryland tributaries where they were spawned.

The closure is extended through May $31^{\rm st}$ in the Susquehanna Flats, Lower Susquehanna River, and North East River. This area is an important striped bass nursery in the upper Bay that in recent years has remained closed to targeting later than the rest of the Bay.

Violation of this closure is punishable by fines up to \$1,000 for the first offense, and up to one year in jail and/or a \$2,000 maximum fine for second offenses.

Anglers are encouraged to target other fish during this emergency closure. Blue catfish and snakeheads are invasive species that have a sportfishing following and harvesting them contributes to a healthier ecosystem in the Bay. Tips and methods for fishing blue catfish can be found on the DNR website.

In the Chesapeake Bay, early summer regulations return on May 16th for certain areas, and on June 1st for the entirety of the Bay and its tributaries.

More information on Maryland's state fish can be found on DNR's striped bass webpage. The department also shares guidance on responsible catch and release, as well as an advisory forecast for fishing striped bass in the summer. Visit www.news.maryland.gov/dnr.





U.S. Government Invests \$1,071,000 for University of Maryland Eastern Shore's New School of Veterinary Medicine

Legislation signed into law by President Biden

U.S. Senator Chris Van Hollen, a member of the Appropriations Committee, and U.S. Senator Ben Cardin (both D-Md.) announced \$1,071,000 in direct federal funding for the University of Maryland Eastern Shore's (UMES) School of Veterinary Medicine within the fiscal year 2024 funding package passed by the Senate. These funds, included at the Senators' request, will support UMES in establishing a new Doctor of Veterinary Medicine Program, making UMES the second HBCU in the country and the first university in Maryland to offer such a program. The program will prepare students for careers as pet and agricultural veterinarians and support the industry's growing demand.

"Investing in the education of Maryland's future veterinarians will help protect our agricultural economy and improve access to veterinary care. These funds will make UMES a regional pioneer, providing top-notch education in veterinary medicine and creating opportunity for students to enter an understaffed but critical field," said Senator Van Hollen.

"The Eastern Shore is a powerhouse for agriculture in Maryland. Establishing a program at one of the region's premier institutions will provide more opportunities for young people to learn the tools of the trade in their own backyard," said Senator Cardin. "With the proven track record of UMES student and professor success stories, we know this program will provide a valuable pipeline to an industry that is in critical need of well-trained professionals."

career and technical education (C T E) program comor plete the

equivalent of a high school-level apprenticeship.

According to the U.S. Department of Labor and Apprenticeship USA, the number of students participating in apprenticeship program increased 118% over the last decade, from 119,996 to 262,221 youths.

Two Kent County High School students are currently enrolled in apprenticeships, Ethan Clark at Chesapeake CNC Manufacturing and Trevor Fuchs at Owings and Sons.

During his apprenticeship work periods, Fuchs can be found working fields and pursing his career dreams in farming. "I wanted to work in agriculture," Fuchs said of why choose to sign on with an apprenticeship at Owings and Sons.

Likewise for Clark, he saw an apprenticeship at Chesapeake CNC Manufacturing as an opportunity to get a jumpstart in the workforce. "I encourage everyone to try and get an apprenticeship, it gives you
